with Heirloom Tomatoes

- ▶ Your Organization will raise \$1.00 per plant.
- ▶ You and your donors will be supporting local farming and bio diversity.
- ▶ All prices include tax.
- ▶ Prices are \$2.50 per plant. Collections, which are our choice, have 5 plants for \$10.00.
- ▶ Print the order form and the descriptions back to back. And distribute to your donors.
- ▶ Orders need to be received by March 20th.
- ▶ Orders will be dated and filled in chronological order. Some substitutions may occur in event of a sell out. Plants will be substituted with a similar type of plant.
- ▶ Delivery of all plants, to your organization, will be in the last two weeks of May. The plants will be hardened off and ready to plant the May long weekend, weather permitting. Please note we wait and plant June 1st.
- ▶ Plants may be picked by the organization or individuals at the farm by pre-arrangement 613-548-4331.

Ordering Plants:

To receive orders, print the first two sheets front to back.

Distribute the sheets with in your community.

Collect the order sheets with payment by March 20th.

Indicate date to be picked up or delivered.

Old Farm will be paid on the date of delivery.

From each plant sold your organization receives \$1.00.

If you would prefer to hold a plant sale.

1. Book the date by March 10th.
2. The plants will be delivered the day before or the morning of the plant sale. Dates in May till the first week in June are suggested for optimal sales. The plants will be a majority of heirloom tomatoes, plus cross section of other heirloom vegetables we carry (see the descriptions in the “Collections” on the order form).
3. Old Farm will not be present during the sale.
Descriptions and providence of all plants is printed on the containers.
4. All plants at the sale are priced at \$2.50.
5. Your organization keeps \$1.00 per plant.
6. Accounting is done with a before and after count.
7. Old Farm will pick up the unsold plants.

Note: Deliveries will only be made within a hundred kilometer radius of Kingston.

Yellow Pear	Very tasty cherry tomato on large 6-foot plant. Heirloom from 1800's.				
Green Cherry	Juicy olive shaped tomatoes in clusters of 4-12.				
Hawaiian Pineapple	Large bi colour of yellow marbled with red. One of our favorites.				
Mortgage Lifter	Large meaty pink fruit on a huge plant. Developed in the 1930's.				
Black Cherry	Mahogany to purple round cherry tomatoes that look and taste great.				
Brandywine Red	Old Amish heirloom from 1885. Large plants with large globe shaped fruit.				
Opalka	Long pointed fruit, meaty and few seeds. Peels well when blanched, and looks gorgeous in mason jars with a few sprigs of basil. Polish heirloom.				
Cherokee Purple	Dark pink with purple shoulders, large fruit. Heirloom over 100 years old.				
Stupice	Heirloom from Czechoslovakia. Very early 6 to 8 oz. round red fruit.				
Black Zebra	Beautiful green and mahogany stripes.				
Sunray	Solid meaty yellow tomato that always performs and tastes great.

Heirloom Tomato and Vegetable Collections

We grow over two hundred varieties of tomatoes, sixty types of peppers, twenty varieties of basil, countless varieties of cucumbers, squash, salad greens, onions, melons, and eggplants. You will save money, and have a diverse interesting garden by allowing us to pick your plants. Each collection contains five plants.

1. **Beefsteak:** A selection of large red and pink slicing tomatoes.
2. **Cherries:** Cherry tomatoes ranging in colour from white, yellow, pink, black and red. Always a snack waiting for you in the garden.
3. **Paste:** Try a variety of paste tomatoes from around the world. Heirloom paste tomatoes are still great for eating fresh, and have few seeds.
4. **Yellows:** These tend to be lower in acid, and sweeter than red tomatoes.
5. **Blacks:** These types tend to have deep mahogany flesh with green shoulders., exceptional taste and eye appeal.
6. **Mixed Colours:** A selection of colours, sizes and shapes. Colours range from, white, yellow, orange, pink, purple, red, green and black.
7. **Bi-colour:** A selection of striped or marbled tomatoes, colours range from green and yellow, yellow and red through green and red. Flavours are complex.
8. **Earliest:** Heirlooms tend to have long maturity dates, but this group will surprise you. This selection includes cherry, medium and large tomatoes.
9. **Livingston Collection:** A.W. Livingston (1821-1898) was a seedsman from Ohio, who claims to have developed the first smooth red tomato, through selection. If you are looking for old fashion tomato flavour, this is the collection for you.
10. **Suitable for Containers:** This group will allow you to grow your tomatoes in pots at the cottage, on the balcony or patio. Many are dwarf plants and/or determinate, setting their fruit in a short period of time.
11. **Hot Peppers:** A variety of hot and chili peppers from such countries as Bulgaria, Portugal, and Mexico. Great for making your signature **Chili Sauce**.
12. **Sweet Peppers:** Sweet peppers in mini to giant, yellow, green, red and purple.
13. **Frying and Drying Peppers:** These thinner-skinned peppers usually have some heat, and are great for making your own paprika.
14. **Basil:** A range of flavours, which may include lemon, cinnamon, lime, anise, and Italian large leaf types used in pesto.
15. **Eggplants:** This selection features eggplants from around the world (such as: Thailand, Japan, Italian, and Romania).
16. **Cucumbers:** You'll be surprised at the diverse colours and shapes of cucumbers available. Don't worry we will include a long green slicer.
17. **Melons:** Our heirloom collection has melons from Canada, France, and Asia.
18. **Squash:** This group includes, Australian, North American, Italian and French squash.

19. **Salad “Greens”:** Try a variety of from, chicory, arugula, romaine, butter head, iceberg and more.

20. **Onions:** A selection of heirlooms ranging from chives to green onions, storing onions, to leeks.
